UMFA, MTS, stand together in defence of public education

Winnipeg - The University of Manitoba Faculty Association (UMFA) is pleased to have the support of the members of The Manitoba Teachers' Society as they continue to push for a fair deal for their members and students. The MTS has written an open letter of support to UMFA members, and President James Bedford joined UMFA members on the picket line this morning.

"We want to thank Manitoba's teachers for their support of UMFA and their ongoing defence of public education in our province," said Orvie Dingwall, UMFA President. "When we stand together, we can improve learning and working conditions for both faculty and students throughout Manitoba."
